
2009 GMSI Summer Camp

General Information

This Summer Camp will bring together 77 Ph.D. students in a variety of engineering subjects and from many different backgrounds. Students will work together in small teams to address a topic related to engineering and society. Teams have been selected based on each student's topic preference, while attempting to maintain group diversity. To help associate names with faces, we will ask everyone for a *brief* self-introduction at the opening of the camp.

Participants will share a Japanese style room with three to eight others, and all meals will be taken at the hotel. Meals and lodging will be paid for by GMSI. Note there are *no* restaurants or convenience stores nearby, although drinks and snacks can be purchased at the hotel gift shop. You are invited to use the public baths (*onsen*) but remember, no bathing suits allowed! An additional charge may be required for use of other facilities.
