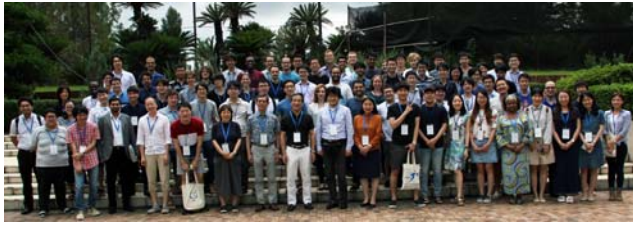

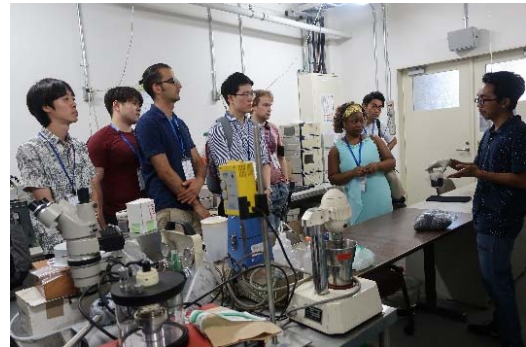
2017 Summer Camp Report
