

2013 GMSI Summer Camp

General information

This year's Summer Camp will bring together 33 graduate students from a variety of engineering fields representing 12 universities in 8 countries. Participants will be divided into small teams, and the task of each team will be to present a novel idea for a product or service related to one of the following five topics:

- Energy
- Environment
- Health & Welfare
- Information Technology
- Safety & Security

The organizers will attempt to maintain team diversity while assembling teams based on similar research fields. The teams will be announced shortly before the start of the camp.

To help everyone get to know each other there will be a 'Technical Session' in which everyone is requested to introduce themselves and their research in a brief (5 minute) Powerpoint-style presentation. Your teammates will likely not be experts in your field, so please keep your presentations somewhat general (i.e., no conference-type talks).

All meals and lodging will be provided during the camp, and lodging in Tokyo will be provided for the days immediately before and after the camp. Visits to some GMSI-related laboratories at the University of Tokyo will be arranged on Sep 27. Details will be announced shortly before the camp.

Notes:

If your travel is paid by GMSI, you **must** give your boarding pass to GMSI staff after you arrive. Also email a scanned copy of the boarding pass for your return flight.

The dress code for the Camp is casual; you do not need any formal clothing.

Summers in Japan are rather hot and humid, averaging around 30°C (86°F) during the day and 24°C (74°F) at night.

Getting from the airport to the hotel

Most participants from abroad will fly into Tokyo's Narita airport. The easiest way to get from the airport to the hotel (Forest Hongo, <http://www.forest-hongo.com/en/location/index.html>) is to take the **Narita Express** (<http://www.jreast.co.jp/e/nex/>) to Tokyo station. The trip takes one hour. After arrival at Tokyo station, take the Tokyo Metro **Marunouchi line** (丸の内線) four stops to **Hongo-Sanchome** (本郷三丁目). The hotel is 10-minute walk from this station (see map below). You need to purchase a ticket to Tokyo Station at the airport, then after transfer Tokyo station, purchase a ticket to Hongo-Sanchome in Tokyo Metro. Note that the Narita express arrives in the lower levels of Tokyo station, so you will need to take the escalator up several levels then you must exit JR lines to transfer to Tokyo Metro. Look for the red circle sign for Marunouchi line.

If your flight arrives at Haneda airport, take the monorail to **Hamamatsucho** (浜松町), where you will need to change to the JR **Yamanote line** (山手線). To transfer you must exit the monorail station and purchase a separate ticket for the JR line. Take the Yamanote line to Tokyo station, where you can change to the Marunouchi line (see above). The hotel location is shown below. This is very close to The University.

Notes:

Very few places in Japan (especially restaurants) accept credit cards. There are also few places to exchange money, so doing so at the airport is recommended.

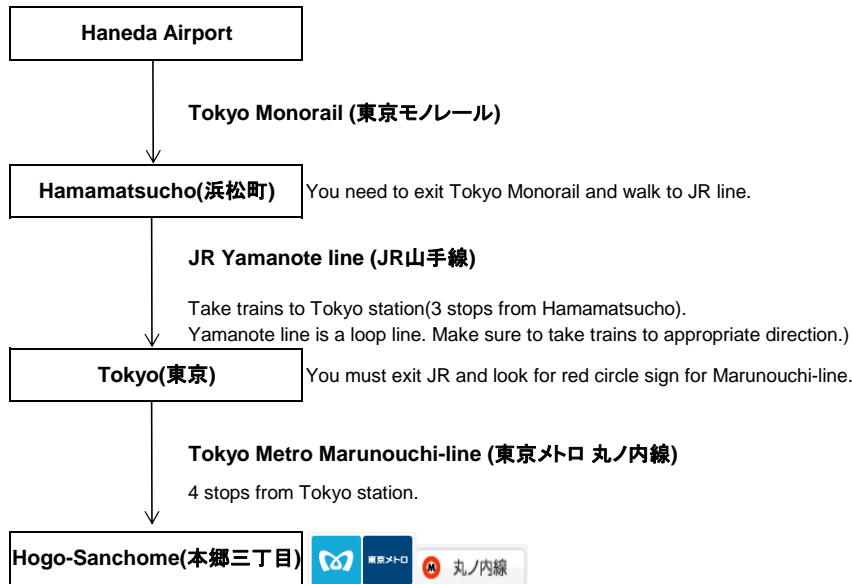
Tokyo subway map

1. Turn right at the exit then you will see big street named "Hongo street" (本郷通り)
2. Turn left and walk on Hongo street
3. When you come to intersection(Hongo 3 chome), go straight towards the University of Tokyo
4. You will pass Todai Akamon : Red Gate of the University of Tokyo, post office and keep going.
5. Turn left at bookstore (井上書店) right before the signal named 東大正門前 (Official Gate of the University of Tokyo)
6. Go straight about 130 meters and you will see Forest Hongo on your right.

Mt. Fuji 5th Sta. Guide Map

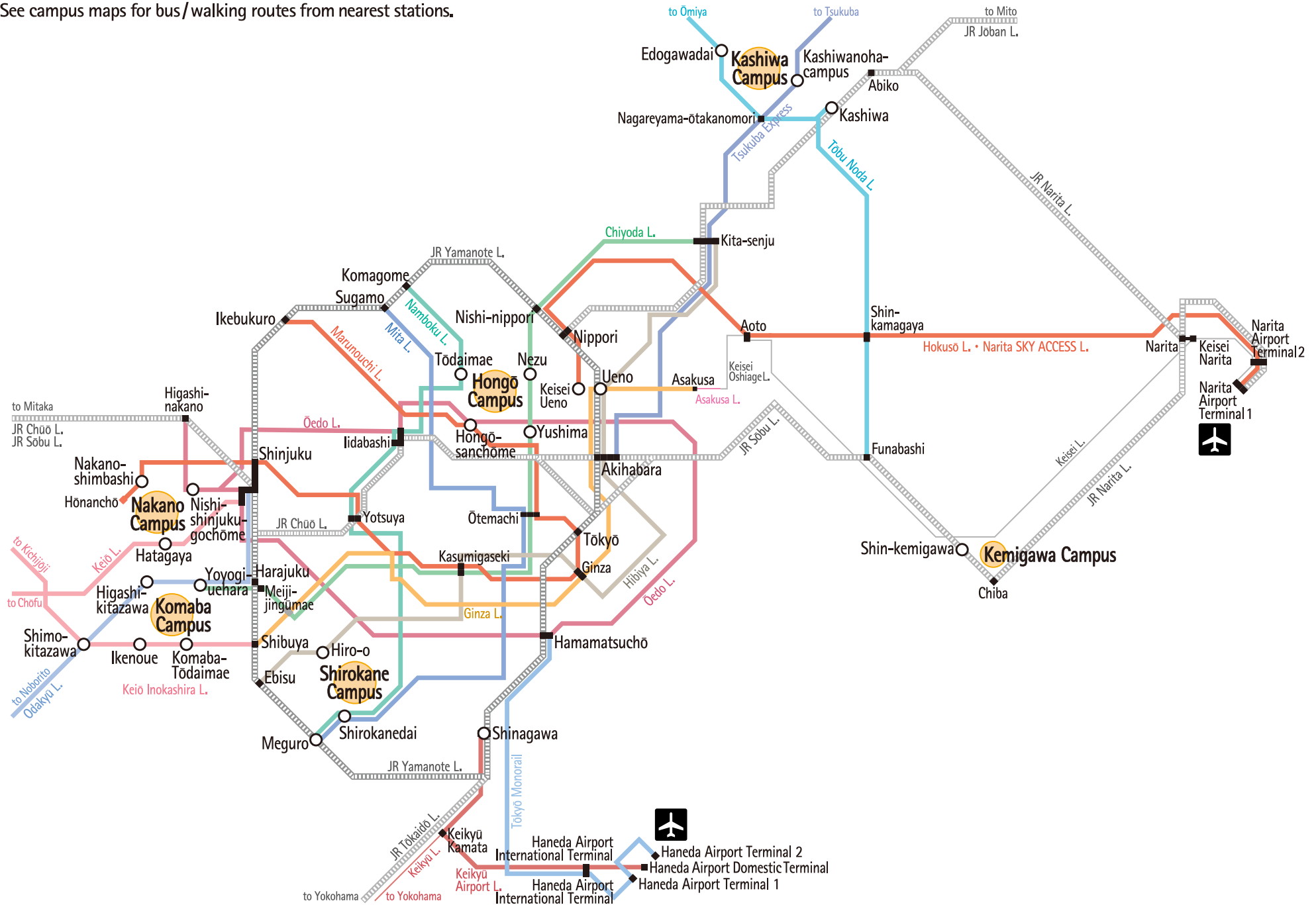
